Donation Guidelines

Charity Storage accepts your new or gently used items in exchange for a donation tax receipt. The items are stored in a secure Charity Storage unit, and then are auctioned off at the next regularly scheduled lien auction or online. After retaining 10% of each auction to underwrite administrative costs, Charity Storage distributes the remaining proceeds in the following manner:

- 60% to a charity of choice of the facility,
- 30% to Kure It Cancer Research
- 10% of the proceeds from each auction go to the SSA Foundation Scholarship fund

There are more than 520 storage facilities enrolled in the Charity Storage Giving Back program, throughout the United States and Canada. We have 200 charities enrolled as beneficiaries of Charity Storage Unit Auctions. We appreciate your support in our effort to revolutionize charitable giving from the storage industry.

The following items are most suitable for Charity Storage Auction, though the final decision rests with the facility management.

- Furniture
- Toys
- Tools
- Sports equipment
- Art and décor
- Holiday décor
- Records, CDs, DVDs
- Working electronics
- Clean clothing
- Baby items
- Exercise equipment
- Luggage
- Appliances
- Household items
- Office equipment
- Hobby supplies
- Crafts and sewing
- Instruments
- Camping equipment
- Gardening supplies
- Pet supplies

For the safety of our auction buyers, the following items **cannot be accepted** as donations: *

- **Mattresses**
- **Pornography of any type**
- **Guns or weapons of any type**
- **Drugs or drug paraphernalia**
- **Any flammable, hazardous or toxic material**
- **Tires**
- **Perishable food items**
- **Alcohol or tobacco products**
- **Dirty clothing or items**
- **Anything that is in not working, or not in salable condition**

* Store managers maintain the right to refuse items that are not in suitable condition.



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
